UNIT UPDATES

Preparing for what's to come

Our members at the ACLU of Minnesota have been working with Minnesota lawmakers to strengthen protections against the civil liberties violations it anticipates under the Trump administration. This initiative is called the <u>"Firewall For Freedom"</u> and seeks to insulate Minnesota from the worst harms of the Trump administration through a states' rights framework. The Firewall's priorities include:

- Expanding privacy protections
- Protecting the LGBTQ+ community
- Prioritizing Equal Rights and Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion
- Protecting Immigrants
- Addressing Gap in Policing Investigations
- Protecting Protest Rights

The ACLU of Minnesota is calling on Governor Walz's office to act upon these priorities before January 20th, 2025 by calling a special session of the Minnesota Legislature.

SCHOLARSHIP FOR '25-'26

The <u>CWA Joe Beirne Foundation</u> will

award **16 college scholarships** of **\$4,000** each for the 2025-2026 and 2026-2027 academic years. CWA members, their spouses, children, and grandchildren are eligible for scholarships, including the dependents of retired, laid-off, or deceased members.
